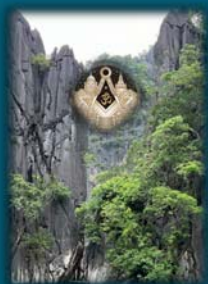

From the East

Brethren and Friends of the Lodge,

One month into our Lodge's 120th Masonic Year and as we prepare for February's Events, I send you greetings from the East.

Unfortunately, some behaviour was outside accepted etiquette, and this occurred in front of the inspector, therefore, I have asked the Senior Warden and MFC Coach come up with an article to remind folks of what Lodge Etiquette should be.

I call upon each of us to consider the reasons for his participation in this Fraternity, the values of this Fraternity and his goal to be the best, most honest and respectful version of himself.

Furthermore, I ask each of you to remain steadfast to your values, to draw conclusions based on your personal experiences, and to be intolerant of gossip and behaviors which could result in injuring brothers in their person or good name.

Masonic Formation Class

Respectfully submitted by James Gonzalez, PM, MFC Coach

During the first month of 2025, our 120th Masonic year, Columbia Brotherhood officers and coaches have facilitated two Masonic Formation Class (MFC) Meetings.

This month's MFC Meeting activities included continuation the exploration of lodges which consolidated to become Columbia Brotherhood Lodge No. 370; short talks on the Halliwell Manuscript / Regis Poem (one of the old charges Circa mid-15th century which discussed Operative Mason practices during the time of King Athelstan, considered to be the first King of England); meaning of clothing oneself; and Masonic Etiquette.

Participants shared a meal, discussed their interests, goals and connection to Freemasonry; listened to short talks, discussed those talks, and discussed questions presented by participants. Collective efforts resulted in progress toward Entered Apprentice proficiencies.

Excerpts from the Masonic Etiquette discussion and a high-level list of future MFC Class topics are provided below.

In the interest of in practicing respect for the Worshipful Master, the Lodge, fellow Lodge Members, and Freemasonry in general should be guided by the following input on Masonic Etiquette.

Masonic Etiquette

THE MASTER'S AUTHORITY – During his term in office, the brother who has been elected as Master is the most powerful member of the Lodge. He also shoulders all its many responsibilities and has the authority to:

1. Rule any brother out of order on any subject at any time.
2. Decide what can and cannot be discussed. A brother who believes that the Master is arbitrary, unjust or unfair or is acting in an illegal manner, he can appeal to the Grand Master.
3. If that brother insists on speaking after the Master has ruled that he is out of order, he may be committing a Masonic offense.
4. Courteous brethren accept the requests made by the Master to serve on various committees such as serving on a committee or performing other duties, as determined by the Lodge's needs.

Masonic Etiquette Continued

STATEMENTS ABOUT MASONIC ETIQUETTE:

1. Passing between the Altar and East when the Lodge is open is considered a lack of Masonic Etiquette, bad form or bad manners.
2. Brethren do not take a seat in the East without an invitation.
3. Brethren always enter the lodge fully dressed and ready for labor.
4. Brethren stand when they speak.
5. Talking in the Lodge
 - a. "Side" talk while a degree is being conferred is considered bad manners.
 - b. Talking without asking shows irreverence for the proceedings.
 - c. If a Brother has something to say, he should raise his hand, upon recognition by the Master, he must stand up and be recognized by the Master to speak.
6. Brothers wishing to offer a predetermined motion or matter for discussion should advise the Master before the meeting.
7. All Brothers must immediately obey the gavel. The Master is all powerful in the lodge, and his word is final. He can put (start it moving or begin a process) or refuse to put any motion. He can rule any brother out of order on any subject at any time. He can say what he will and will not permit to be discussed. Brethren who think him unfair, arbitrary, unjust, or acting illegally have redress, however, in the Lodge the Master's gavel, which is his emblem of authority, is supreme. When a brother is rapped down, he should obey at once, without any further discussion. It is VERY bad manners to do otherwise. In fact, it is perilously close to the line between bad manners and a Masonic offense.
8. A brother should never turn his back on the Master to address the Lodge without first receiving permission from the Master to speak.
9. Each of the Brethren will salute the Master when he enters or leaves the Lodge room.
10. Brethren may not enter or leave the Lodge room during a ballot.
11. When an issue is put to a vote, all Brethren are mandated to vote.
12. Brethren are not allowed to smoke in the Lodge room.

- 13.** It is good Masonic Etiquette for a Brother to accept a request made in the name of the lodge if it is within his abilities.
- 14.** Lodge customs state that no one except for the Worshipful Master or his prearranged designee, may correct any mistake that may occur during a Ceremony, and even he does so only when the error is a serious one.
- 15.** Good posture is necessary while within the Lodge room. Lounging, leaning and slovenly attitudes should be avoided.
- 16.** The lodge room is not a proper location for the telling of practical jokes, pranks, horseplay or off-color stories.
- 17.** It is common courtesy to be accurate in speaking a brother’s name, so it is proper Masonic etiquette to address officers, members, and visitors by their correct Masonic titles and addresses.
- 18.** If a Brother should enter the Lodge after a meeting has begun or in which a ceremony is under way, he should go to the Altar to salute the Master. If he must leave before the meeting is over, the correct Masonic etiquette of his departure is to go to the Altar and salute the Master before he departs. The salute should always be given properly and not in a careless or perfunctory manner.
- 19.** All prayers at Lodge functions are non-sectarian.
- 20.** All cell phones should be turned off before entering the lodge room so as not to disrupt the proceedings.

Happy Chinese New Year to all!

Just a friendly reminder the dues for 2025 of \$88.50 are now considered delinquent. We appreciate the brethren who have already paid.

Why am I receiving a notice from the Grand Lodge?

We are participating in the Grand Lodge's dues notification program, where they handle all the printing and mailing of notices. This service helps the Lodge save significantly on printing and postage costs.

- **Do I have to pay online?**

Not at all! While many brothers find paying online convenient and even have the option to set up automatic payments or renewals for future years, you are always welcome to pay directly to the Lodge by check.

- **They're saying there's a processing fee for online payments.**

Yes, if you choose to pay by card, a small processing fee will be added. This fee goes directly to the credit card processor, and the Lodge receives the full amount of your dues. The Grand Lodge charges the Lodge nothing for this service.

- **Can I still pay with a check?**

Absolutely! If you prefer to pay by check, you should be receiving a printed mailer soon, which might include a return envelope for your convenience.

- **Will you be mailing out dues cards?**

Dues cards will be mailed upon request. Once your 2025 dues are paid, your new card will also be available online at www.freemason.org. You can download and print a valid copy, or access a digital version on your mobile device for identification purposes.

- **Dues have increased, and I'm unable to pay them right now. What should I do?**

Please reach out to me or the retention committee. If you're facing financial difficulties, we have the ability to remit (reduce or forgive) some or all of your dues. I'm happy to discuss this with you in confidence, so please don't hesitate to contact me by phone or email. Don't risk losing your good standing in the Craft by ignoring your dues notice. We are here to help.

- **Is there something I haven't addressed?**

If you need any assistance or have questions, please feel free to reach out to me or any of the officers. We are here to support you.

NAME TAGS: Members who wish to have a new name tag, please take this opportunity to order it. For efficiency and cost saving reasons, I will be taking orders beginning January 10 to April 05, 2025. The cost will be \$15 per name tag.
