

With the advent of the autumn equinox on September 22, we have reached samhain which is pronounced "sow-in" meaning "Summer's end" in old Irish¹ and fall season is upon us in the northern hemisphere. The students in our lives have returned or are returning to school, and as many of us participate to some degree in what our Jewish brethren refer to as the Feast of Tishiri, the Hebrew equivalent to a harvest festival or Thanksgiving², and as those in many countries celebrate Halloween, I send you greetings from the

Officer proficiency practice is planned for Wednesday, October 12, and Masonic Formation classes are planned for October 10th and 17th during which participants will work on proficiencies, plan for the Night in Havana event which is scheduled for October 28.

The Minute Man Trestle Board of Mount Vernon Lodge No. 517 Trestle Board, published in October 1964, reported that, "The officers and members of Mount Vernon Lodge extend congratulations and greetings to Brother Gary Paul Kane who was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on September 18, 1964. Garry is 21 years of age, an honor student in school, graduated from University of California at Berkeley in 3-1/2 years, a member of the Masonic Club at Berkeley. Was accepted at

Boalt Hall, Law College, University of California, now is in his second year. A native of San Francisco, resides with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Philip J. Kane...."

Columbia Brotherhood Lodge No. 370 was formed as the result of several lodge consolidations which included Mount Vernon Lodge No. 517, so, so Brother Kane is a member of Columbia – Brotherhood No. 370 lodge. He now resides in Greensboro, NC and is approaching his 60th year as a Master Mason

In addition to the October birthdays of our brothers in Columbia Brotherhood Lodge, No. 370, some other Masonic events which occurred in October are discussed below.

On October 1, 1928, the Philalethes Society, a North American Masonic research society, was organized.³

On October 5, 1874, the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma (Indian Territory) was formed.⁴

On October 11, 1011, Franklin D. Roosevelt, the 32nd U.S. President (1933-1945) received his 1st degree in Holland Lodge #8, New York City.⁴

On October 13, 1778, the Grand Lodge of Virginia was organized.⁴

On October 14, 1989, the Grand Lodge

of Connecticut recognized the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Connecticut. This was the first U.S. recognition of Prince Hall Masonry that remained in force and led to similar actions by more than 2/3 of all U.S. Grand Lodges.⁴

On October 15, 1794, the Grand Lodge of Vermont was organized.⁴

On October 16, 1800, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky was established.⁴

October 18, 1911, the corner Stone was laid in the Construction of the Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction house of the Temple in Washington.²

On October 20, 1920, The <u>Order of</u> <u>Job's Daughters</u>, was founded in Omaha, Nebraska.²

On October 20, 1953, the Grand Lodge of the State of Israel was constituted.⁴

On October 30, 1771, Thomas Smith Webb, (d. July 6, 1819) author of Freemason's Monitor or Illustrations of Masonry, the foundation text of the "York Rite" American system of Freemasonry and the Founding Father of the York or American Rite was born.²

Walking Together

Robert Morris, (August 31, 1818 - July 31, 1888) was a Freemason and a prominent American poet, and after becoming a Mason on March 5, 1846, he, believing that female relatives of Masons needed to share in teachings of Freemasonry, wrote the first ritual of the Eastern Star, entitled, The Rosary of the Eastern Star.5 Morris also wrote many poems related to Masonry and Masonic Symbolism and assembled them into his 1884 book, The Poetry of Freemasonry. Many of these poems have been published in the website referenced in Footnote 6, some of the poems differ from the versions in the above-referenced book, and one poem entitled, Walking Together⁶ follows.



In thought, word, and deed, We too are agreed, From the same Fount Of' Knowledge Instructed; And by the same hand We'll travel or stand, To the same Goal of triumph conducted.

Through the same open door, We lame, blind, and poor Undertook the same mystic endeavor; Through the same grave at last, When death's trial Is past, We'll share the forever and ever.

Our friends are the same, Whatever their name, Whatever their station or nation; The same are our foes, Whose malice but shows Their hearts black with coming damnation.

We too, then, can walk, Sit, stand, work, or talk, In union make sign or give token, And while life remains With its losses and gains Let's see that the tie be not broken!


